



OUR PROCESS

- 1. Students from both Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo Counties exhibiting livestock at the Santa Barbara County Fair apply to 37th Buyer's Coalition to purchase their animal at auction.
- 2. Funds are raised through grants, non-profit partnerships, donors and community fundraising support.
- 3. The 37th Buyer's Coalition Board reviews student applications.
- 4. The Coalition board members attend livestock auctions and purchase animals based on application status, and the need for auction support.
- 5. Animals purchased are then processed and donated to local organizations in need of food assistance.



Micah Mission is a grassroots, based nonprofit organization dedicated to walking alongside individuals and families who are unhoused, under-resourced, marginalized, and living with Housing & Food instability in the Lompoc Valley. Founded in 2017 out of a desire to meet people where they are—physically, emotionally, and practically—we respond to gaps in services and support by building intentional relationships, addressing immediate needs, and fostering long-term stability and restoration

Through weekly programs such as Saturday Meals & Showers and Soup, Salad, and Care for the Soul, along with housing support and coordinated care, Micah Mission is committed to meeting people where they are and providing a consistent, reliable source of help, dignity, compassion, and human connection.

In 2024 alone:

- We served over 10,741 meals
- Offered 2,697+ showers
- Delivered over 152 meals weekly on Sunday evenings, including to encampments, vehicles, and motels
- Reunited 9 individuals with their families and provided housing assistance to 4 households
- Supported hundreds of neighbors living in instability or crisis

Why a Partnership Matters

At Micah Mission, we serve individuals and families living in tents, cars, trailers, or on the edge of eviction-often unseen and under-supported. Protein, especially high-quality meat, remains one of the most requested yet least accessible items in our outreach.
